Argentina

Agreement for exchange of notes between Costa Rica and Argentina on the suppression of visas for holders of diplomatic and service passports, signed in Buenos Aires, Argentina, on 06/17/1992.

Azerbaijan

Agreement between the Government of the Republic of Costa Rica and the Government of the Republic of Azerbaijan on Visa Exemption for Holders of Diplomatic and Service Passports, signed in San José, Costa Rica, on 06/02/2017.

Barbados

Agreement for exchange of notes between Costa Rica and Barbados on visa suppression, signed in San José Costa Rica, on 02/09/1993.

Bolivia

Agreement for exchange of notes between Costa Rica and Bolivia on the suppression of visas for holders of diplomatic, official or service passports, signed in La Paz, Bolivia on 07/15/1988.

Brazil

Agreement for exchange of notes between Costa Rica and Brazil for the elimination of visas for holders of diplomatic and service passports, signed in San José, Costa Rica on 09/20/1974.

Agreement for the Elimination of Visas in Diplomatic Passports, signed in Brasilia, Brazil on 11/06/1996.

Cuba

Agreement between Cuba and Costa Rica on reciprocal exemption from the visa requirement for holders of diplomatic, official and service passports, signed in New York on 10/27/2000.

Chile

Agreement between Chile and Costa Rica on visa suppression, signed in Santiago, Chile on 03/06/1992.

China

Agreement on mutual exemption of visas for diplomatic and service passports, signed in San José on 08/02/2007.

Agreement for exchange of notes between Costa Rica and Colombia for the elimination of visas in diplomatic, official, service and ordinary passports, signed on 07/12/1972.

South Korea

Agreement for exchange of notes between Costa Rica and South Korea San José, signed in Costa Rica on 09/22/1981.

Croatia

Agreement on the Elimination of Visas for diplomatic and service passports, signed in New York on 09/22/1999.

Denmark

Agreement between Denmark and Costa Rica on the suppression of San José visas, signed in Costa Rica on 08/24/1970.

Ecuador

Agreement to eliminate visas in diplomatic, official, service and special passports between Costa Rica and Ecuador, signed in Quito, Ecuador on 03/08/1979.

El Salvador

Agreement to eliminate entry visas between Costa Rica and El Salvador, signed in San José, Costa Rica, on 07/06/1991.

United Arab Emirates

Agreement between the Government of the Republic of Costa Rica and the Government of the United Arab Emirates on the Abolition of the Visa Requirement for Holders of Diplomatic and Special Passports Abu Dabi 18/05/2016.

Spain

Agreement for exchange of notes between Costa Rica and Spain for the elimination of visas in the diplomatic, official and ordinary passports of both countries, signed in San José, Costa Rica, on 04/30/1966.

United States

Exemption from payment for issuance and application of American diplomatic visas, signed in San José, Costa Rica, on 03/02/1999.

Estonia

Agreement between Estonia and Costa Rica on the abolition of visa requirements for holders of diplomatic, service and ordinary passports, signed in San José, Costa Rica on 11/10/2000.

Visa abolition agreement for holders of diplomatic and service passports between Costa Rica and the Russian Federation Moscow, signed in the Russian Federation on 10/16/1997.

Finland

Agreement for exchange of notes between Finland and Costa Rica for the elimination of visas, signed in San José, Costa Rica, on 09/29/1971.

France

Agreement for exchange of notes between Costa Rica and France for the suppression of short-stay San José visas, signed in Costa Rica on 06/16/1998.

Gran Brittany and Ireland

Agreement for exchange of notes on visa abolition between Great Britain and Northern Ireland and Costa Rica, signed in San José, Costa Rica in 1968.

Honduras

Agreement for exchange of notes between Costa Rica and Honduras regarding the elimination of visas in diplomatic, official and special passports exchange of notes, signed in 1992.

Hungary

Agreement for exchange of notes between Costa Rica and Hungary for the elimination of visas in ordinary, diplomatic, official and service passports, signed in San José, Costa Rica on 05/13/1992.

Indonesia

Agreement Between The Government of the Republic of Costa Rica and the Government of the Republic of Indonesia on Visa Exemption for Holders of Diplomatic or Service Passports Jakarta 29/10/2013.

Israel

Agreement for exchange of notes between Costa Rica and Israel on the exemption of visas for diplomatic, official (service) passports, signed in San José, Costa Rica in 1961.

Israel

Agreement for exchange of notes between Costa Rica and Israel for the reciprocal suppression of visas, signed in San José, Costa Rica, in 1968.

India

Agreement on the elimination of Visa Requirements for people with Diplomatic, official and service Passports, signed in San José, on 03/08/19.

Agreement between Costa Rica and Latvia regarding the mutual elimination of the visa obligation, signed in New York, United States on 09/25/2003.

Agreement between CR-Latvia/Latvia: agreement on the mutual elimination of the visa obligation, signed in New York on 07/03/2003.

Lithuania

Lithuania-CR Visa Suppression Agreement, signed in Argentina on 10/30/2003.

Morocco

Exchange of Notes, Suppression of Visas for diplomatic, official and service passports, signed in Morocco on 04/21/2000.

Mexico

Agreement for exchange of notes for the elimination of visas in diplomatic and official passports between Costa Rica and Mexico, signed in Mexico City, Mexico on 05/17/1993.

Monaco

Agreement for exchange of notes on visa suppression between the Principality of Monaco and Costa Rica, signed in San José in 1985.

Nicaragua

Decree number 33130-RE, of April 25, 2006, published in Gazette number 114 of June 14, 2006, on the elimination of the entry visa requirement for Nicaraguan citizens carrying Diplomatic, Official or Service Passports who travel to Costa Rican territory

Norway

Agreement for exchange of notes between Norway and Costa Rica on the suppression of visas, signed in San José Costa Rica in 1969.

Netherlands

Elimination of the need for a consular visa for citizens of the Netherlands and Luxembourg who enter the national territory and remain there for a maximum period of three months, signed in San José, Costa Rica on 08/17/1967.

Netherlands

Convention on the elimination of consular visas for citizens of the Kingdom of the Netherlands and Luxembourg who enter the national territory and remain there for a maximum period of 5 months, signed in San José, Costa Rica on 08/16/1967.

Panama

Agreement for exchange of notes between Costa Rica and Panama for the suppression of consular visas, signed in San José, Costa Rica, on 05/04/1966.

Paraguay

Agreement on Visa Suppression for Diplomatic and Official Passports between the Governments of Paraguay-CR, signed in Asunción, Paraguay on 16/06/1

Peru

Agreement for exchange of notes between Costa Rica and Peru for the elimination of visas in diplomatic, special, official and service passports, signed in San José, Costa Rica on 07/22/1988.

Poland

Agreement by exchange of notes between Costa Rica and Poland for the elimination of visas for people with diplomatic, official, service and ordinary passports, signed in Warsaw, Poland in 1992.

Portugal

Agreement for exchange of notes on visa suppression between Portugal and Costa Rica exchange of notes, signed in 1969.

Dominican Republic

Agreement on the elimination of visas in diplomatic, official and service passports between Costa Rica and the Dominican Republic Santo Domingo, signed in the Dominican Republic on 11/06/1997.

Hellenic Republic,

Agreement between Costa Rica and the Hellenic Republic regarding the elimination of the visa obligation in diplomatic and short-stay service passports, signed in San José, Costa Rica on 09/13/1999.

Agreement for exchange of notes between Costa Rica and Romania on the suppression of visas exchange of notes signed on 10/18/1974.

Sweden

Agreement for exchange of notes between Sweden and Costa Rica on the suppression of visa exchange of notes, signed in 1967.

Switzerland

Agreement for exchange of notes between Costa Rica and Switzerland for the elimination of visas in diplomatic, official, service passports and ordinary exchange of notes, signed in 1966.

Thailand

Visa Abolition Agreement, signed in Thailand on 10/05/2005.

Türkiye

Agreement for exchange of notes for the elimination of the visa requirement between Costa Rica and Turkey, signed in San José, Costa Rica and Mexico City, Mexico on 03/09/1999.

Venezuela

Agreement for exchange of notes between Costa Rica and Venezuela on the suppression of diplomatic, official and service passports, signed in Caracas, Venezuela on 03/17/1997.

Vietnam

Agreement between the Government of the Socialist Republic of Vietnam and the Government of the Republic of Costa Rica on Visa Exemption for Holders of Diplomatic or Service/Official Passports. signed in Ha Noi on July 4, 2012.

Brunei Darussalam

There is a Unilateral decision to exempt Diplomatic, official and service passports from visas, through note verbale JPK/1226/2018, effective as of September 1, 2018.
