



- 1950s: 'computers', 'half-caste' domestic servants
- 1960s: highest birth rate in Australia
- 1970s: end of Australia's space age


WOMEN'S Interest in Woomera

Melbourne. — Australian women are keenly interested in jobs at the Woomera Rocket Range.

More than 70 women and girls have applied to the Long Range Weapons Board of Administration for forty computing jobs.

Most sent written applications to Salisbury (SA), but some wrote and applied personally to officers of the Commonwealth Department of Supply and Development in Melbourne and Sydney.


Women will be paid between $\pounds 6/3/$ and $\pounds 7/2/$ a week and girls, between $\pounds 4/9/$ and $\pounds 5/17/$. Their job will be to compute and dissect the result of rocket experiments.







