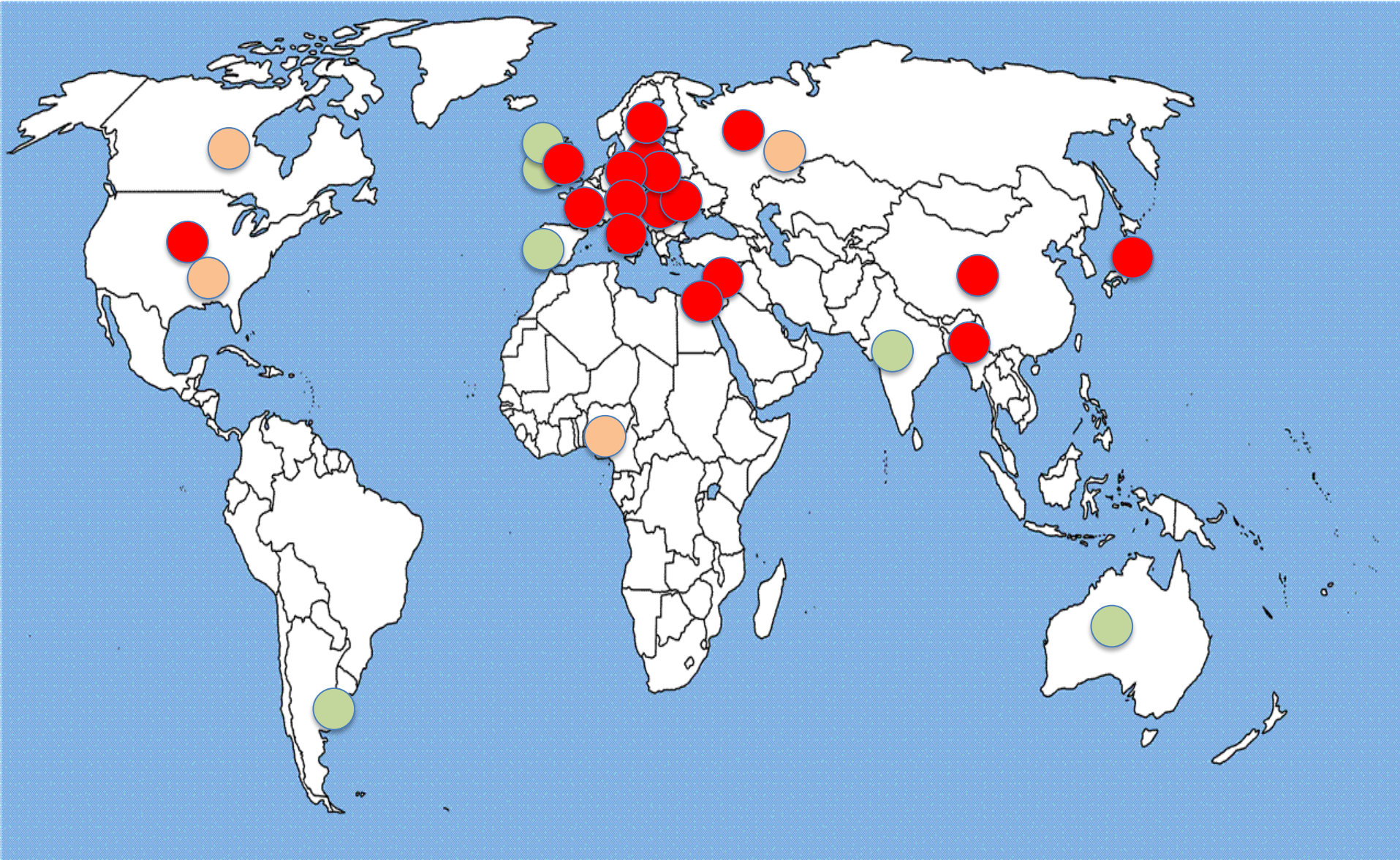

IAIN CONTRIBUTION TO ICG

IAIN might be a voiceover for the ICG and also provide a sort of market research facility

IAIN members might also be able to advise the ICG as to what the user community actually thinks, principally the various transport modal communities, surveying and mapping and personal navigation.

>> *IAIN as “voice” of the User Communities*

Except civil aviation and maritime which are regulated at international level through ICAO and IMO respectively, other transport modes such as railway or road transport have a very local or regional regulation.



IAIN CONTRIBUTION TO ICG

In the nations of its Members IAIN would:

- ✓ Promote the use of GNSS, properly integrated with other time distribution and positioning techniques to ensure the provision of a continuous and resilient service, to the entire user community, and
- ✓ Foster the integration of satellite navigation with the other technologies, to improve efficiency and security of various modal transports.

Also the education and training on GNSS systems is of interest for the Institutes of Navigation

As a consequence, IAIN would like to propose the change of status, from **Observer** to **Associated Member**



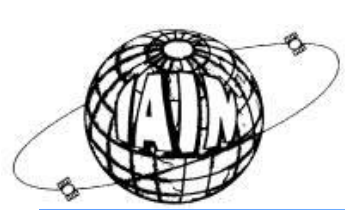
