1022nd meeting

General exchange of views [4]

The Subcommittee continued its consideration of this item with statements by the representatives of Iran (Islamic Republic of), Thailand, Czechia, Egypt, and Colombia.

A statement was also made by the observer for the International Peace Alliance (Space).

National legislation relevant to the peaceful exploration and use of outer space [8]

The Subcommittee continued its consideration of this item with statements by the representatives of Japan, Kenya, Iran (Islamic Republic of), India, and the Russian Federation.

Capacity-building in space law [9]

The Subcommittee continued its consideration of this item with statements by the representatives of Japan, the Philippines, Kenya, South Africa, and Austria.

A statement was also made by the observer for the Asia-Pacific Space Cooperation Organization.

General exchange of views [4]

The Subcommittee continued its consideration of this item with statements by the observers for the Space Generation Advisory Council, the Open Lunar Foundation, and the UNISEC-Global.
