General exchange of views [4]

The Subcommittee continued its consideration of this item with statements by the representatives of Indonesia and Mexico.

General exchange of views on potential legal models for activities in the exploration, exploitation and utilization of space resources [9]

The Subcommittee suspended its consideration of this item with statements by the representatives of Argentina, Brazil, Canada, India, Indonesia, Italy, Mexico, the Republic of Korea and Türkiye.

A statement was also made by the representative of Indonesia in the exercise of the right of reply.

The observer for the Space Generation Advisory Council (SGAC) also made a statement.
