





Overview of the Report submitted to the 60th Session of LSC (2021)

- Report was prepared by the NSLI Study Group, consisting of 9 NSLI participating organizations from Asia-Pacific region, covering the following topics:
 - Overview of Space Activities
 - Ratification Status regarding the International Regime
 - National Legal Scheme relating to Space Activities

This submission was expected to contribute to the implementation of the United Nations Resolution, A/RES/68/74: Recommendations on national legislation relevant to the peaceful exploration and use of outer space

	1. The Asia-Pacific Regional Space Agency Forum (APRSAF) was established in	
	1993 in response to the declaration adopted at the Asia-Pacific International Space Year Conference (APIC) in 1992, in order to promote and enhance space activities	
	and international cooperation in the Asia-Pacific region. APRSAF has been holding annual meetings, jointly organized by Japan's Ministry of Education, Culture,	
	Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT), the Japan Aerospace Exploration Agency (JAXA) and the organizations of host countries. APRSAF has been supporting the	
	establishment of various collaboration initiatives to address common issues, such as	
	disaster management, environmental protection and capacity-building for space environment utilization, so that participating parties will benefit from mutual	
	cooperation. Through four working groups, members can share information about the activities and future plans of each country and of the region.	
	2. In response to a growing interest in space policy and law within the Asia-	
	Pacific region, the Forum initiated a new space policy community-building effort in the region. APRSAF began holding a space policy plenary session during the	
	twenty-fourth assaion, held in Bangalore, India, in 2016. Since then, AFRSAF has been providing space policy practitioners in the region with opportunities to	
	exchange information on their respective national space policies and laws and to	
	network in order to enhance mutual understanding. Such efforts include the Space Policy Practitioners Workshop and the Inter-Regional Space Policy Dialogue

[History]

Building on the experience of NSLI, the Space Policy and Law Working Group (SPLWG) was established at APRSAF27(2021) based on a recommendation from the NSLI Study Group.

[Objective and Scope]

- To enhance the capacity in space policy and law of each country, acknowledging that space technology and space policy and law are inseparable pairs in respect to space related activities.
- To share information and mutual learning on the practice of policy and law in each country and the policy options toward common regional issues.
- To discusses global issues as a contribution from the region, such as ensuring the long-term sustainability of space activities and the stable use of outer space.


Conclusion and Way Forward
