General function of satellite:

JETS-1 (Japanese Engineering Test Satellite-I) is intended for preliminary experiments for confirmation of the launching technologies, acquiring the satellite tracking and control technologies, and for extention tests of the extendable antennas, measurement of satellite environment, measurement of satellite attitudes, etc.
