Objectives of UN-SPIDER TAM Follow-up

- 1. To learn about the role of international emergency mechanisms established by space agencies such as the International Charter Space and Major Disasters and Sentinel Asia.
- 2. To simulate exercises based on the activation of the International Charter during dam collapse in Lao PDR in July 2018;
- 3. To impart map reading skills to the participants in utilizing emergency response maps produced through the Charter mechanism.
- 4. To strengthen the voluntary community LaoNGUM;
- 5. To reinforce the need of close coordination among geospatial professionals and end users.

- 2. To formulate the SOP in term of early warning at local province;
- 3. To continue to pursue with the UN-SPIDER TAM Follow up:
 - Undertake a pilot activity on building the safe district from disaster for targeting district at local province with UN-SPIDER and its partners and China;
 - Call for financial support from UN-SPIDER to be able to have TAM Follow up at local province.
