Report of the Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space

[Original text: English] [27 November 1961]

- 1. The Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer bace, which was established by the General Assembly 12 December 1959, was convened on 27 November 61 by the Acting Secretary-General in view of the sponse which he had received from members of the mimittee.
- 2. After hearing the opening remarks of the Acting cretary-General, the Committee, without objection, opted its agenda and proceeded to elect its officers. bon the nomination of Canada, seconded by the nited Arab Republic, Mr. Franz Matsch (Austria) is elected Chairman; upon the nomination of Czechovakia, seconded by India, Mr. Mihail Haseganu Romania) was elected Vice-Chairman; upon the nominion of the United States of America, seconded by

Sweden, Mr. Geraldo de Carvalho Silos (Brazil) was elected Rapporteur.

- 3. After statements by the Chairman, the Vice-Chairman and the Rapporteur, members proceeded to the discussion of other business before the Committee, during the course of which statements were made by the representatives of the United States of America, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, Canada, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, France, India, Brazil, Italy, Poland and Australia. The attention of the General Assembly is invited to the verbatim record of the Committee's meeting (A/AC.105/OR.1) which includes the contents of those statements.
- 4. The Committee adjourned sine die.

NTERNATIONAL CO-OPERATION IN THE PEACEFUL USES OF OUTER SPACE

A

The General Assembly,

Recognizing the common interest of mankind in thering the peaceful use of outer space and the

urgent need to strengthen international co-operations in this important field,

Believing that the exploration and use of outer space should be only for the betterment of mankind and to

the benefit of States irrespective of the stage of their economic or scientific development,

- 1. Commends to States for their guidance in the exploration and use of outer space the following principles:
- (a) International law, including the Charter of the United Nations, applies to outer space and celestial bodies;
- (b) Outer space and celestial bodies are free for exploration and use by all States in conformity with international law, and are not subject to national appropriations by claim of sovereignty or otherwise.
- 2. Invites the Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space to study and report on the legal problems which may arise from the exploration and use of outer space.

The General Assembly,

Believing that the United Nations should provide a focal point for international co-operation in the peaceful exploration and use of outer space,

- 1. Calls upon States launching objects into orbit or beyond to furnish information promptly to the Secretary-General for the registration of launchings;
- 2. Requests the Secretary-General, in connexion with the peaceful use of outer space and making the fullest possible use of existing resources:
- (a) To maintain a record of information received concerning objects launched in orbit or beyond in accordance with paragraph 1 above and to communicate such data, upon request, to States Members of the United Nations and members of the specialized agencies;
- (b) In consultation with appropriate specialized agencies, to maintain close contact with governmental and non-governmental organizations concerned with outer space matters;
- (c) To provide for the exchange of such information relating to outer space activities as Governments may supply on a voluntary basis, supplementing but not duplicating existing technical and scientific exchanges;
- (d) At the request of the Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space or other appropriate international bodies, to assist in the study of measures for the promotion of international co-operation in outer space activities;
- (e) To report to the Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space and to the General Assembly on the service arrangements undertaken for the performance of these functions and on such developments relating to the peaceful uses of outer space as he considers asignificant.

The General Assembly,

Noting with gratification the marked progress for meteorological science and technology opened up by the advances in outer space,

*Convinced of the world-wide benefits to be derived trom international co-operation in weather research and analysis,

1. Recommends to all Member States and to the World Meteorological Organization and other ap-

propriate specialized agencies the early and compr hensive study, in the light of developments in our space, of measures:

(a) To advance the state of atmospheric science an technology so as to provide greater knowledge of base physical forces affecting climate and the possibility large-scale weather modification;

(b) To develop existing weather forecasting ca abilities and help Member States make effective use such capabilities through regional meteorologic centres;

- 2. Requests the Secretary-General to seek the view of national Governments on these matters and, in co sultation with the World Meteorological Organization the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Ct tural Organization, and other appropriate specializ agencies and non-governmental organizations such the International Council of Scientific Unions, to range for the submission of a report to the Econom and Social Council at its thirty-fourth session regardi appropriate organizational and financial arrangement to achieve these ends, with a view to their further of sideration by the General Assembly at its seventee session;
- 3. Requests the Committee on the Peaceful Uses Outer Space, as it deems appropriate, to review report and submit its comments to the Economic Social Council and to the General Assembly.

Convinced of the need to prepare the way for establishment of effective operational satellite c munications.

- 1. Notes with satisfaction that the Internation Telecommunication Union plans to call a special ference in 1963 to make allocations of radio freque bands for outer space activities;
- 2. Recommends that the International Teleco munication Union consider at this conference t aspects of space communications in which internation co-operation will be required;
- 3. Notes the potential importance of communication satellites for use by the United Nations and its p cipal organs and specialized agencies for both ope tional and informational requirements;
- 4. Invites the Special Fund and the Expan Programme of Technical Assistance to give sympath consideration to requests from Member States for the nical and other assistance for the survey of their munication needs and for the development of domestic communication facilities so that they make effective use of space communication;

- 1. Decides to continue the membership of the Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space as set forth in General Assembly resolution 1472 (XIV) and to add Nigeria and Chad to its membership in recognition of the increased membership of the United Nations since the Committee was established;
- 2. Requests the Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space to meet early in 1962 to carry out its mandate as contained in General Assembly resolution 1472 (XIV), to review the activities provided for in resolutions A, B, C and D above and to make such reports as it may consider appropriate.

Financial implications of the draft resolution submitted by the First Committee in document m A/5026Note by the Secretary-General

[Original text: English] [13 December 1961]

- 1. The First Committee at its 1214th meeting, on December 1961, adopted a draft resolution calling the Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space undertake a number of new tasks in 1962 (A/5026,
- 2. In accordance with rule 154 of the rules of produre of the General Assembly, the Secretary-General omits the following statement of the financial implitions which might result from the implementation of draft resolution.
- The new tasks assigned to the Committee on Peaceful Uses of Outer Space will almost certainly essitate a strengthening of the servicing staff. The cretary-General will endeavour to meet these needs so far as possible from within existing resources of Secretariat.
- 4. However, in the event that recourse to temporary recruitment of additional substantive and clerical staff becomes necessary or, as may prove essential, the employment of some technical scientific experts is required to assist the Committee in its work, the Secretary-General will report fully to the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions as soon as the related financial implications can be assessed.
- 5. Should the General Assembly adopt the draft resolution, it would be the intention of the Secretary-General to enter into commitments in 1962 in regard to such additional costs which might arise under paragraph 4 above under the terms of paragraph 1 of the resolution relating to unforeseen and extraordinary expenses for the financial year 1962.

DOCUMENT A/5026 Report of the First Committee

[Original text: English] [13 December 1961]

At the fifteenth session of the General Assembly, consideration of the item "Report of the Committee the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space" had been deed until the sixteenth session, as recommended by First Committee in its report (A/4749), which had noted by the General Assembly at its 995th plenary ting. Accordingly, the item was included in the visional agenda of the sixteenth session.

At its 1014th plenary meeting, on 25 September 5. Requests the Secretary-General, in consultar, the General Assembly decided, on the recom-

- 4. At its 1209th meeting, on 30 November 1961, the First Committee decided to consider the item as the fifth item on its agenda.
- 5. The First Committee considered the item at its 1210th to 1214th meetings, between 4 December and 11 December 1961.
- 6. At the 1210th meeting on 4 December 1961, the representative of the United States introduced a draft resolution (A/C.1/L.301) sponsored by Australia, Canada, Italy and the United States of America. A revision of this draft resolution (A/C.1/L.301/Rev.1 and Rev.1/Corr.1) was submitted to the Committee on 11 December at its 1214th meeting, with the following sponsors: Albania, Argentina, Australia, Austria, Belgium, Brazil, Bulgaria, Canada, Czechoslovakia,
