At the end of the morning meeting (572nd) of the Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space, *today*, 11 June 2007, there will be special presentations on "Space Disposal of Nuclear Waste" by Mr. Oleg Ventskovskiy of Ukraine, on "Intersputnik as Provider of State-of-the-art Satellite Communications Services" by Mr. Victor S. Veshchunov of the International Organization of Space Communications (Intersputnik), and on "Yuzhnoye Design Office Technologies in the National and International Space Programmes" by Mr. Oleg Ventskovskiy of Ukraine, in Conference Room III.

Special Symposium

A special symposium on the theme "Space and Water", organized by the Office for Outer Space Affairs, in cooperation with the Institute for Global Mapping and Research (Austria), will be held *today*, Monday, 11 June 2007, in Conference III, at 4:00 p.m., following the adjournment of the 573rd meeting of the Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space.

The symposium aims to explore the role of space technology applications in addressing global challenges to the world's water resources and discuss most adequate strategies/tools to ensure wider access to safe, clean and sustainable water, with the view of providing decision-makers with space-derived tools to implement sustainable use of water. The symposium will be moderated by Mr. Lothar Beckel of the European Academy of Sciences and Arts. Presentations will be made on "Space-based Data and Inter-jurisdictional Water Resources Management", on "Space and Water for Life", on "Role of Space-based Systems for Water Resources Management", on "Advances in Systemic Observations of Surface Water and Marine Environment in Africa", on "Nigerian Perspective on Space and Water Resources Management", and on "Latin American Perspective on the Use of Space Technology for Water Resources Management".
