## **SUMMARY OF SCHEDULED MEETINGS**

### **672<sup>nd</sup> meeting**

#### *Near-Earth objects [9]*

The Subcommittee suspended its consideration of this item with a statement by the representative of the Republic of Korea.

#### *International Heliophysical Year 2007 [11]*

The Subcommittee continued its consideration of this item with statements by the representatives of Nigeria, China, Hungary, Canada, the Republic of Korea, Indonesia, and Chile.

The observer of the Spaceweek International Association (SIA) also made a statement.

#### *Draft provisional agenda for the forty-fifth session of the Scientific and Technical Subcommittee [13]*

The Subcommittee began its consideration of this item.

#### *Special Presentations*
