

^{*} In paragraph 4 of its resolution 61/111, the General Assembly endorsed the recommendation of the Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space that the Legal Subcommittee, at its forty-sixth session, taking into account the concerns of all countries, in particular those of developing countries, should consider items 3, 4, 5 and 6 as regular items of the agenda, should consider items 7 and 8 as single issues and items for discussion and should consider item 9 in accordance with the workplan adopted by the Committee. In paragraph 5 of the same resolution, the Assembly noted that the Subcommittee, at its forty-sixth session, would submit proposals to the Committee for new items to be considered by the Subcommittee at its forty-seventh session, in 2008.

- 10. Proposals to the Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space for new items to be considered by the Legal Subcommittee at its forty-seventh session.

4. Status and application of the five United Nations treaties on outer space

In paragraph 6 of its resolution 61/111, the General Assembly noted that the Legal Subcommittee would reconvene its Working Group on the Status and Application of the Five United Nations Treaties on Outer Space and review the need to extend the mandate of the Working Group beyond the forty-sixth session of the Subcommittee.

At its fortieth session, in 2001, the Legal Subcommittee agreed that the topics addressed in the discussions of the Working Group would include the status of the treaties, the review of their implementation and obstacles to their universal acceptance, as well as the promotion of space law, especially through the United Nations Programme on Space Applications (A/AC.105/763 and Corr.1, para. 118). At its forty-first session, in 2002, the Subcommittee agreed that the Working Group would review any new, similar issues that might be raised in discussions in the Working Group, provided that those issues fell within its existing mandate (A/AC.105/787, paras. 138 and 140).

5. Information on the activities of international intergovernmental and nongovernmental organizations relating to space law

In the discussion of item 5, member States may bring to the attention of the Legal Subcommittee any information on the activities of international organizations relating to space law.

6. Matters relating to:

- (a) The definition and delimitation of outer space
- (b) The character and utilization of the geostationary orbit, including consideration of ways and means to ensure the rational and equitable use of the geostationary orbit without prejudice to the role of the International Telecommunication Union

In paragraph 7 of its resolution 61/111, the General Assembly noted that the Legal Subcommittee would reconvene its Working Group on this item only to consider matters relating to the definition and delimitation of outer space.

9. Practice of States and international organizations in registering space objects

In paragraph 8 of its resolution 61/111, the General Assembly agreed that the Legal Subcommittee should reconvene its Working Group on the Practice of States and International Organizations in Registering Space Objects in accordance with the workplan adopted by the Committee at its forty-sixth session, in 2003. In accordance with that workplan, the Working Group would, in 2007, prepare a report to the Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space.

Annex

Organization of work

- 1. At its forty-fifth session, in 2006, the Legal Subcommittee agreed that a flexible organization of work should continue to be organized with a view to making the best use of the available conference services (A/AC.105/871, para. 11). The work of the Subcommittee has been scheduled to afford the working groups that will be reconvened under items 4, 6 (a) and 9 the maximum amount of time available.
- 2. At the close of the afternoon meetings on 26 and 27 March 2007, a symposium with the theme of capacity-building in space law, sponsored by the International Institute of Space Law and the European Centre for Space Law, will be held.
- 3. An indicative schedule of work is provided below.
