GES offers:

- 1. A vision for robotic and human space exploration
- 2. A voluntary framework to develop collaboration

GES Features

- A voluntary, non-binding mechanism
- Not a proposal for a single program
- Open to new participants
- Sets stage for development of an "international coordination mechanism"

Future Coordination Mechanism

 Space exploration coordination should be based on:

- Openness and inclusiveness
- Flexibility and evolutionary approach
- Effectiveness
- Establishment of mutual interest
