## II. Replies received from member States

### Serbia

Under the plan of use of radio frequencies in force, the term “outer space” is defined as “outer space at a distance of 2 million km or more from the Earth”.

### Thailand

Although Thailand has not yet developed any national legislation or national practices that related directly or indirectly to the definition and/or delimitation of outer space and airspace, Thailand has consistently taken the position that this is an undeniably classic legal issue that needs urgent clarification.

### Tunisia

[Original: French]  
[11 November 2009]

Laws on the definition and delimitation of outer space are not provided for by Tunisian legislation. The same applies to airspace, whose delimitation is governed by the relevant international conventions.
