**Information furnished in conformity with the Convention
on Registration of Objects Launched into Outer Space**

**Note verbale dated 5 May 2008 from the Permanent Mission of the
Russian Federation to the United Nations (Vienna) addressed to
the Secretary-General**

The Permanent Mission of the Russian Federation to the United Nations (Vienna) presents its compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and, in accordance with article IV of the Convention on Registration of Objects Launched into Outer Space (General Assembly resolution 3235 (XXIX), annex), has the honour to transmit registration data on space launches by the Russian Federation for November 2007 and also on the space objects that ceased to exist during that period (see annex).



Registration data on space launches by the Russian Federation for November 2007*

1. In November 2007, there were no launches of space objects belonging to the Russian Federation.
2. In November 2007, the Russian Federation launched the following space objects on behalf of foreign clients:
 - On 1 November 2007, a German SAR-Lupe remote Earth-sensing satellite, designed to perform tasks on behalf of the Ministry of Defence of Germany, was launched into Earth orbit by a Kosmos-3M carrier rocket from the Plesetsk launch site;
 - On 18 November 2007, a Swedish Sirius-4 telecommunications satellite was launched into Earth orbit by a Proton-M carrier rocket with a Breeze-M booster from the Baikonur launch site.
3. The following space object ceased to exist in November 2007 and was no longer in Earth orbit at 2400 hours Moscow time on 30 November 2007: 1996-060A (Molniya-3).
