The Subcommittee continued its consideration of this item with statements by the representatives of Algeria, Austria, Belgium, Canada, China, Cuba, Egypt, Iran (Islamic Republic of), Japan, Morocco, the Republic of Korea, Romania, the Russian Federation, the United States and Venezuela (Bolivarian Republic of).

Statements were also made by the representatives of Austria and the Russian Federation in the right of reply.

The representative of Liechtenstein as ad hoc observer also made a statement.
