










All countries and all stakeholders act in **collaborative partnership to implement the 2030 Agenda** for Sustainable Development.

Women in STEM & Space

- Only 1 in 5 countries have achieved gender parity in STEM researchers
- The world average 30 per cent
- Space industry women workforce 20 per cent


