

A Unique Lunar Side Event at the 68th Session of COPUOS

The Open Lunar Foundation and the Lunar Policy Platform Foundation are honoured to invite the distinguished Delegations of all Member States and Permanent Observers participating in the 68th Session of COPUOS to a side event titled *Towards Peaceful, Safe, and Sustainable Lunar Activities*.

Initially incubated by the **Open Lunar Foundation**, the **Lunar Policy Platform** (**LPP**) in 2025 transitioned into an independent non-profit. This year, the Open Lunar Foundation funded LPP's work on Lunar Information Sharing and Lunar Science & Ethics.

Structure & Goals

The event will begin with opening remarks from ATLAC Co-Chair Dr. Ulpia Botezatu, continue with expert presentations from LPP and Open Lunar on three lunar policy projects, and conclude with a Q&A to answer questions, discuss feedback, and outline next steps.

This event is organised for educational purposes to support the leading work of the Committee in the area of lunar activities, provide an opportunity to share feedback on relevant projects, and foster potential collaborations.

The Lunar Information Sharing 101 and the Lunar Science & Ethics Guide

Following the *Lunar Policy Priorities Report* and 2024 *Lunar Policy Snapshot*, in 2025 LPP is working to develop two voluntary reference documents outlining core elements, guiding principles and streamlined practices on lunar information sharing and lunar science & ethics, based upon common ground between a diverse group of actors.

The Lunar Ledger - Global Lunar Database of Objects and Activities

Developed with input from over 150 stakeholders across three years, Open Lunar is building a neutral, voluntary platform as an operational reference point, similar to a "Lunar activity Wikipedia", offering structured, accessible mission data, submitted directly by state and non-state actors, on lunar objects and activities to support transparency, cooperation, and coordination.
