Mr. Chairperson,

As we go through turbulences in the world stage, and taking into account the growing importance of space activities and applications for economies and peoples, it is essential to reiterate our collective commitment to existing Space Law and guiding principles, as adopted by these United Nations.

Space must remain peaceful, as a driver for economic, social and environmental development. Furthermore, the benefits of space technology must be available to all nations, irrespective of their degree of economic development. Access to space and to space activities for peaceful purposes must not be limited or restricted under any guise. Outer space is the province of humankind

Mr. Chairperson,

All space activities must strictly adhere to established international and space law. Where new issues emerge – whether in space resource utilization, lunar activities,

long-term orbital sustainability, or space traffic management – we must develop robust regulatory frameworks.

In this endeavor, COPUOS retains its vital role as the primary forum for shaping space governance. We reaffirm its centrality in developing norms – both legally binding instruments and politically binding commitments – to ensure space remains a secure, sustainable province of humankind.

Mr. Chairperson,

In terms of national implementation, Brazil continues to build its domestic regulatory and institutional framework. Last year, shortly after the 67th COPUOS Plenary Session, Brazil adopted a new Space Activities Law. We are currently working on regulating its specific provisions.
