Basic Facts about SGAC

- Founded as a result of the 1999 UNISPACE III Conference
- SGAC has had permanent observer status in UN COPUOS since 2001 and has been a member of the UN Economic and Social Council since 2003
- SGAC has a volunteer network of more than 15,000 members in over 150 countries





Space Law and Policy Project Group

- One of 9 SGAC Project Groups
- Currently have 65 members from Asia, Oceania, North America, Africa and Europe
- Open to any member of SGAC
- One of the stated purposes of SGAC is to give the next generation of space leaders a voice in global space policy
- •Contributes to SGAC preparations for Legal Subcommittee



Project Group Objectives

- Engage in critical debates about actual legal and policy aspects concerning space activities
- Investigate legal and regulatory challenges faced by the space community
- Propose space-related policy recommendations
- Address potentially emerging questions and issues in the space sector

Space Law and Policy Directory Project

- •Establishing a regularly updated Space Law and Policy Directory
- •Facilitating access to the publicly available main space-related legal and political documents in the UN Member States
- •Functioning as a free service to the international space community



Spaceports Project

- •Working in cooperation with the Centre for a Spacefaring Civilization
- Examining existing initiatives, laws and policies in US, UK, New Zealand, Australia and EU
- Looking for 'lessons learned' and best practices
- •Report will be published later this year



- Looking at the space treaties, particularly the OST through the lens of its drafting history
 Build upon Cologne Commentary, besides doing independent research on the travaux préparatoires
- •Currently conducting initial research and recruitment
- Initial report may be presented at the IAC 2019
