Leading up to the WSF 2019

Preparing for UNISPACE+50:

High Level Fora were held in 2015 (Vienna), 2016 and 2017 (Dubai), 2018 (Bonn)

Integrating outcomes of **UNISPACE+50**: The creation of the „**Space2030**“ **Agenda** was decided

Austria decided to host the 5th High Level Forum in 2019 with the focus on Access to Space for All

Rebranding to World Space Forum: A unique brand, allowing name recognition





Goals for the WSF 2019

- **Opening up the UN dialogue on Space** for various actors ranging from private sector representatives, experts, policymakers, governmental and non-governmental organizations, young experts
- Allow **networking** and strengthening of **partnerships** among the global space community
- Create room for **in-depth discussions about key topics**
- Promoting the **link** between the WSF and COPUOS





1st World Space Forum

- 299 participants from 66 Member States, UN organizations, industry
- 104 female, 195 male participants
- **Forum Programme:**
- **4 Sessions** gathering technical experts
- **4 Panels** bringing together decision-makers
- **Interactive elements:** Poster Session, Open Panel on UN-Space, Focus Session, 2 Technical Tours to RUAG Space Austria and the Planetarium, Vienna


