> INFORMATION FURNISHED IN CONFORMITY WITH GENERAL ASSEMBLY RESOLUTION 1721 B (XVI) BY STATES LAUNCHING OBJECTS INTO ORBIT OR BEYOND

Letter dated 18 February 1966 from the Permanent Representative of the United States of America addressed to the Secretary-General

In accordance with the provision of part B, paragraphs 1 and 2, of United Nations General Assembly resolution 1721 (XVI), I enclose registration data concerning objects launched into orbit or beyond by the United States. With these additions to the record, Your Excellency will have received for the Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space and for the Public Registry a complete registry of all United States space vehicles in orbit or beyond as of 15 December 1965.

In addition there is included supplemental information concerning
United States space vehicles which were launched on 4 December and 9 December 1965
and which achieved orbit but were no longer in orbit as of 2400Z on
15 December 1965.
