Time of launching: 0222 hours 11.4 seconds GMT

Place of launching: Western Test Range, USA

Date of launching: 9 March 1974

Apogee: 913 km

Perigee: 710 km

Interjection point: 13.9°N 126.0°E

Nodal period: 101 minutes

Inclination of orbit: 97.80

Anticipated life: longer than 50 years

Launch vehicle: Scout
