4. Arrival/Departure to/from Ulaanbaatar

Option 1: Chinggis Khaan International Airport (formerly Buyant Ukhaa Airport) (IATA: ULN, ICAO: ZMUB) is the international airport situated 18 km (11 mi) southwest of Ulaanbaatar.

Option 2: New Ulaanbaatar International Airport (NUBIA) (IATA: UBN, ICAO: ZMCK) will open on 1st May 2021 and is situated 52 km (32 mi) south of Ulaanbaatar.

All workshop participants will be met at the airport by a representative of the local organizer and accompanied to their hotels.

Participants are requested to inform the local organizer of their Estimated Time of Arrival and Departure (ETA/ETD).

6. Currency

The currency used in Mongolia is the "Mongolian Tugrik (MNT)".



Major credit cards (American Express, Diners Club, Master Card and Visa) are accepted at hotels, restaurants and shops in Mongolia.

7. Power Supply

220-volt, 50 Hz power supply is used in Mongolia for standard domestic and business purposes. Hotels generally provide wall sockets for two-pin plugs (Type C).





8. Time, Weather and Health Care

The time zone in Ulaanbaatar is UTC+08:00.

The workshop will be held during the autumn season (October) when temperature ranges from an average low of -4.8°C to an average high of +7.6°C. There are, however, variable weather and temperature conditions that have been observed over the past years. Therefore, it is recommended to consider warm clothing.

Mongolia does not specifically recommend any vaccinations. <u>However, in light of the global</u> <u>Covid-19 pandemic, vaccination against Covid-19 is mandatory.</u> Participants are advised to consult their medical services for any updates prior to their departure.

Please be reminded that adequate health insurance is the participant's personal responsibility.

9. Communication

The international dialling code for Mongolia is: (+976).

Local service providers operate on the GSM standard. 3G and 4G networks are also available via roaming.

10. Safety and Security

As of March 2021, the overall safety and security situation in Ulaanbaatar is stable. The security level is assessed at Level 1 (Minimal).

Nevertheless, care should be taken in busy areas and late at night.

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11. About Ulaanbaatar

Ulaanbaatar is the capital and largest city of Mongolia with a population of over one million. As an independent municipality, the city is not part of any province. Located in north-central Mongolia, the city lies on the Tuul River, at an elevation of about 1,310 meters. It is the cultural, industrial and financial heart of the country and serves as the hub for Mongolia's road network, connected by rail to both, the Trans-Siberian Railway in Russia and the Chinese railway network.

Sightseeing



The Government Palace is located on the north side of Sukhbaatar Square in Ulaanbaatar. It houses various state organs such as the State Great Khural and offices of its members, as well as the offices of the President and Prime Minister. In front of the Palace stands the Chinggis Khaan Statue, which was unveiled in 2006.



Mongolia's wonderful National Museum guides visitors from the Neolithic era to the present days. It is Ulaanbaatar's only genuine sight, offering an overview of Mongolian culture ranging from stone-age petroglyphs and exquisite gold ornamentation to the full gamut of traditional ceremonial costume.



This monastery is one of Mongolia's most important and biggest tourist attractions. The full name, Gandantegchinlen, translates roughly as 'the great place of complete joy'.



Built between 1893 and 1903, this palace is where Mongolia's eighth Living Buddha, and last king, Jebtzun Damba Hutagt VIII (often called the Bogd Khan), lived for 20 years.
