# A leitmotiv of space law...

to prevent outer space from becoming an area of conflict;

to distribute space benefits between space-faring and non-space-faring States;

to advance the exploration and use of space through resource efficiency.

#### **International cooperation** is central for ESA!

- c) governments, organisations and institutions of non-member States

# **European Centre for Space Law (ECSL) I**



- Set up by the ECSL Charter in 1989 under the auspices of the European Space Agency (ESA)
- The day-to-day running, promotion and relations with Members is carried out by the Executive Officer, supported by the ECSL Board comprised of 10 Board Members
- Located in ESA HQ in Paris, France
- Promotes and supports capacity building and exchange of expertise and knowledge
- Furthers the development of space law, space policy and regulation in Europe through
  - Academic activities
  - Industry-focused activities and workshops



# European Centre for Space Law (ECSL) II



#### Members of the Centre include:

- Students,
- Individuals (professionals and academics) and
- Institutional Members (ministries, universities, private companies, international organisations)
- ECSL events address current topics such as
  - The role of law and policy in fostering a sustainable space sector
