UNISPACE+50 Heads of Space Agencies Panel Statement of the Swiss Space Office SSO

Madam Chair Dear colleagues

It is a distinct pleasure to join today's panel! The space sector is going through a phase of rapid evolution, if not to say revolution, opening up new opportunities to address long-term sustainable development concerns of humankind.

The quantity and timeliness of data from Earth Observation systems allow an almost real-time look at our planet. Satellite operators are connecting more and more remote communities to the internet, which is becoming truly ubiquitous. The final element of this triad of space tools is precision navigation, which is helping us to increase efficiencies in logistics, agriculture, air-travel, just to name a few. We support the definition of a "Space 2030" agenda, which encourages the leveraging of these space infrastructures in support of sustainable development!

What is the approach of the Swiss Space Office? Switzerland has developed niches of excellence and high competence.
