UNCCD background



 The United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD) was established in 1994 to protect and restore our land and ensure a safer just, and more sustainable future.

• One of the three Rio Conventions



 The UNCCD is the only legally binding framework set up to address desertification and the effects of drought. There are 197 Parties to the Convention, including 196 country Parties and the European Union.

UNCCD 2022 Reporting Process

- Regional and global aggregates compiled from 115 national reports and 52 government-approved estimates, all derived from Earth observations data sources
- The benefits of open data, as espoused by the Group on Earth Observations (GEO), have been demonstrated in this national reporting process with Parties having access to over 70 Earth observation data layers spanning 20 years and collated from the best available open data sources.
- UNCCD undergoing a data-driven transformation in line with the Secretary General's 'Data Strategy for Action by Everyone, Everywhere'
