SUMMARY OF SCHEDULED MEETINGS

786th meeting

Opening of the session [1]

The session was opened at its 786th meeting.

Adoption of the agenda [2]

The provisional agenda (A/AC.105/L.327) was adopted.

The Committee decided to admit the representative of Uzbekistan to participate in the session as an observer.

The Committee decided to admit the observers of the Holy See and the Hague Institute for Global Justice to participate in the session as observers.

Statements were made by the representatives of Austria and the Russian Federation.

Election of officers [3]

Mr. Omran Sharaf of the United Arab Emirates was elected to the office of Chair of the Committee, Ms. Jenni Tapio of Finland was elected to the office of First Vice-Chair of the Committee, and Mr. Oleg Ventskovsky of Ukraine was elected to the office of Second Vice-Chair/Rapporteur of the Committee for the period 2022–2023.
