

1014th meeting

Adoption of the Agenda [1]

Ms. Nomfuneko Majaja of South Africa was elected Chair of the Subcommittee.

Statement by the Chair [3]

The Chair made an opening statement outlining the work of the Subcommittee.

Organization of work

The Subcommittee decided to invite the observers of the League of Arab States, the Hague Institute for Global Justice, and the International Peace Alliance (Space) to participate in the session as observers.

General exchange of views [4]

The Subcommittee began its consideration of this item with statements by the representatives of Morocco on behalf of the Group 77 and China, Egypt on behalf of the African Group, Finland, The Philippines, Kenya, Italy, Cuba, France, and Ukraine.

The observer for the European Union also made statement.

A statement was also made by the Office for Outer Space Affairs.
