

General exchange of views [4]

The Subcommittee continued its consideration of this item with statements by the representatives of South Africa, the Republic of Korea, and Japan.

Status and application of the five United Nations treaties on outer space [6]

The Subcommittee suspended its consideration of this item with statements by the representatives of South Africa, Germany, the Russian Federation, the Netherlands, and Indonesia.

A statement was also made by the observer for the Secure World Foundation.

General exchange of views on potential legal models for activities in the exploration, exploitation and utilization of space resources [15]

The Subcommittee suspended its consideration of this item with statements by the representatives of Finland, Japan, Greece, New Zealand, the United Kingdom, the Russian Federation, Australia, Italy, China, Brazil, Malaysia, Indonesia, and Pakistan.

Statements were also made by the observers for the Secure World Foundation and the Open Lunar Foundation.
