

The Subcommittee continued its consideration of this item with statements by the representatives of New Zealand and Spain.

The observer for the European Space Agency (ESA) also made a statement.

National legislation relevant to the peaceful exploration and use of outer space [7]

The Subcommittee concluded its consideration of this item with statements by the representatives of Australia, Austria, China, Colombia, Indonesia, Kenya and the United States.

The observer for the SKA Observatory (SKAO) also made a statement.
