

SUMMARY OF SCHEDULED MEETINGS

834th meeting

Opening of the session [1]

The session was opened at its 834th meeting.

Adoption of the agenda [2]

The provisional agenda A/AC.105/L.341 was adopted.

Statement by the Chair [3]

The Chair made an opening statement outlining the work of the Committee.

General exchange of views [4]

The Committee began its consideration of this item with statements by the representatives of Kenya on behalf of the G77 and China, Burkina Faso on behalf of the African Group, Peru on behalf of the Group of Latin America and Caribbean Countries, Australia, Bulgaria, Canada, Chile, China, Djibouti, Egypt, Germany, Iran (Islamic Republic of), Italy, Japan, Latvia, Morocco, the Russian Federation, Slovakia, Slovenia, South Africa, the Syrian Arab Republic, Türkiye, the United Arab Emirates and the United Kingdom.

The observer for the European Union also made a statement.

A statement was also made by the Director of the Office for Outer Space Affairs on the work of the Office.

Statements were made by the Russian Federation and the United Kingdom in the right of reply.

The Committee decided to admit the representatives of Cambodia, Côte d'Ivoire, Honduras, Lao People's Democratic Republic, Maldives, Malta, the Republic of Moldova, Serbia and Uganda to participate in the session as observers.

The Committee decided to admit the representative of the Holy See to participate in the session as an observer.

The Committee also decided to admit the observers for ACES Worldwide, African Space Agency, Lunar Policy Platform Foundation and Women in Aerospace Europe to participate in the session as observers.

835th meeting

General exchange of views [4]

The Committee continued its consideration of this item with statements by the representatives of Algeria, Argentina, Austria, Bahrain, Belarus, Belgium, Brazil, Burkina Faso, Colombia, the Dominican Republic, Ecuador, France, Guatemala, Hungary, India, Israel, Kazakhstan, Kuwait, Luxembourg, Netherlands (Kingdom of the), Pakistan, Panama, the Philippines, the Republic of Korea, Romania, Saudi Arabia, Singapore, Sweden, Switzerland, Thailand and Venezuela (Bolivarian Republic of).

Statements were made by Iran (Islamic Republic of), Israel, the Russian Federation and Ukraine in the right of reply.

Ways and means of maintaining outer space for peaceful purposes [5]

The Committee began its consideration of this item with statements by Kenya on behalf of G77 and China, Japan and the Russian Federation.

The Committee decided to admit the representative of the League of Arab States to participate in the session as an observer.
