The Subcommittee began its consideration of this item with statements by the representatives of Morocco on behalf of the G77 and China, Burkina Faso on behalf of the African Group, Australia, Belgium, Canada, China, Costa Rica, France, Italy, Morocco, Netherlands (Kingdom of The), New Zealand, Singapore, Slovakia, Slovenia, South Africa, Spain, Thailand, and the Russian Federation.
